Rock-A-Thon is always an integral time for the men of Alpha Epsilon Pi. It's a time where brothers come together to fight against a cause that's bigger than ourselves. In celebrating our 54th anniversary, we ask everyone who has been involved with this event or anyone affected by this heinous disease to join our fight against cancer.

It all started in 1969, when Jack Fishman and rocker Gary Panitz spearheaded a campaign that would raise \$3,205.29 for the March of Dimes. 54 years and over \$1,200,000 later, AEPi Rock – A – Thon is the most successful Greek philanthropy in the United States.



In 2021, Rock-A-Thon raised \$180,000 to support the fight against lung cancer. Our efforts in 2021 would not have been possible without the generosity of people who connected with our mission. Even in the face of a pandemic, we saw the outpouring of support from our loved ones, even strangers, and couldn't be more grateful for their contributions. This year, we'll be able to interact in-person with all of our supporters, and we can promise that our brothers are committed to this cause that unites so many.

This year, we are spotlighting head, neck, and brain cancer. Head, neck, and brain cancer accounts for nearly 4% of all cancer cases in the U.S. There will be roughly 66,000 people diagnosed with head and neck cancer in the United States in 2023, and there are already over 700,000 living with a primary brain tumor. We hope to continue raising awareness of this deadly disease and fight head, neck, and brain cancer together.



Everyone involved in this event has been affected in some way or another by cancer, as have millions nationwide. We are honored to be able to host such an event to raise awareness and money to help find a cure. As we come together as a brotherhood this upcoming spring, we ask for the support of anybody willing and able in our fight against cancer.
